# Carving Hints from Smoky Mountain Woodcarvers Supply Catalog

Sharp tools are a necessity not a luxury. Cleaner cuts in wood and less cuts in your skin.

Never resharpen any tool unless you have to due to breaking, chipping or reshaping). Only strop or buff to maintain the edge.

Stropping: Make sure you keep all of the bevel in contact with the strop. Lay the blade flat on the strop and exert a small amount of pressure so that you maintain the correct contact. When you reach the end of the strop turn the blade so the sharp edge comes up and away from the strop. Just turn it over sop it is flat again and strop. Be sure to use a small amount of strop abrasive.
