
#### Big Change for the EOWA Woodcarvers and Folk Art Show

Good for turning carving and furniture making

Works well with only a slight dulling of cutters.

Weight 33 lbs per u.ft. Finishes well

#### TAXODIUM DISETICHUM

Grows in southeastern USA in wet regions and swamps

Straight grain oily texture, yellowish brown Works well, dulls cutters
Accepts finishes well

Weight 30 lbs per cu.ft.

Lay the blade flat on the strop and exert a small amount of pressure so that you maintain the correct contact. When you reach the end of the strop turn the blade so the sharp edge comes up and away from the strop. Just turn it over so it is flat again and strop. Repeat several times. Be sure to use a small amount of strop abrasive.
