The North Texas Woodcarvers guild has disbanded. This club was older than our club and sponsored one of the major carving shows in our area. The Dayton show, a national biggie has ended.

The EOWA has been shutdown since March.

We are trying to get things going again, but without member support it may never happen.

We have restarted our regular monthly meetings, and we have a Tuesday afternoon carving session from 1 to 3 PM in Broken Arrow.




Photo Show and Tell: Rusty Johnson has been working on this bust of Hunkpapa Lakota leader Sitting Bull since before the pandemic and is

This series of photos of a Skylar Johnson resin cast study stick show the steps in carving a wood spirit face. Figure 1 shows the initial cuts for the hairline, the eyebrow line and the bottom of the nose. Figure 2 shows roughing in the eyes, the cheekbones and the nose. Figure 3 brings more detail - hair part, eyebrow definition, more eye definition, nose and mustache.

Figure 4 is the final piece with detail of hair, beard, eyes and other lines in the face. The stick comes with printed tips for different tools to use with each step.

Other study sticks by Skylar Johnson include nose, eyes, and smouth and all are available on the internet for around \$21 each. They are a great reference tool for all levels of carvers.

A new wood store has opened in Claremore. The owner runs a tree service, so he is salvaging wood from trees he removes. He has local woods, walnut, hackberry, catalpa, box elder, elm, etc. All is slabbed and dried.
