Aesculus pavia
Light weight and easy to work

Sources. Central US
Used mostly for carving

Straight grain with fine texture
Pale brown heart wood

Shop tips

To clean out those small corners after sanding and before finishing use a 1/2 inch stiff bristle paint brush and trim it to a point. It will get into those small corners. A stiff tooth brush works well also

When finishing a carving or toy for a child, the best finish is Shellac. Its is non-toxic. It is even approved by the FDA for drug and candy coatings.

Tips for Head Proportions from Bob Block

The Magic 45 Degree Angle

Width is 5 eyes (sometimes a bit more for base of nose, can be up to 1.5 eye width.

Forehead is 3 planes, not flat (although planes are rounded)

Face has a downslope from cheekbone to chin. Find cheekbone below eye socket.

Cranial Mass:

Ear to nose = ear to skull back. Shortening this is a common error – be sure you have enough wood!

Face: Eyes are about half way from top of head to chin.

Tip of nose is about half way from eyes to chin. Mouth is about half way between tip of nose and chin.

The Mandible: Attaches at "ear hole," about in center of normal ear.

Ear: From top or about middle of eyeball (not the eye showing, but from the ball. Goes to bottom of nose if nose is not exaggerated.

Eyes: the eyeball is just about ROUND.
Eyelids: Eyeball presses against lid. Upper lid is thicker and closes OVER the lower lid.
Nose: Base of nose is about 1.5 eye length (variable)

3 planes in FRONT of eyeballs. Have fun with the tip of the nose.)

Mouth: Follows the CURVE of the teeth. Upper lip overhangs lower lip usually. Lower lip overhangs chin. Usually a curve between lower lip and top of chin. Chin is variable in shape and size.

Neck: Various length and thickness. Obviously, (usually) feminine neck is more slender with a gently forward thrust and curve.

All necks: NOT a straight line, (not a pipe to hold up the head). Slopes down and back, especially children and females and elders.

Use 30 degree forward slant from the clavicles as a guide.

Shoulders: Man = 3 heads from center of neck – Woman is smaller (Again, this varies from person to person.)

A COUPLE OF IDEAS:

Turn the head when you can, and tilt it up a bit when you can (unless the person is looking down!)

Hats: This is often overlooked – check pictures and find a live model: hat must fit on head at about the top of the ear or a bit lower. Clay modeling is best way to practice: no need for detail!
